Dear Friends & Neighbors:

We continue to see more zoning change requests on the Waccamaw Neck and we need your help. Thanks to the generous financial support of our 2,800 members, KIG has been able to successfully stop a number of zoning changes that would have resulted in increased residential density.



KIG spends countless hours carefully reviewing each new zoning change application, investigating the facts, researching the law, drafting position statements and other communications, and coordinating public response. It is time consuming and expensive work, but it is making a difference.

Recent Zoning Change Request/ Related Lawsuit

The following is a recent zoning change request and related lawsuit in which we had to become involved very quickly, and there are more coming our way in the near future.

Coachman Drive

Due to strong opposition from neighbors and KIG at the March Planning Commission hearing, a developer has withdrawn his request to change zoning from residential to commercial on a parcel of land in a residential neighborhood near Coachman Drive in order to accommodate another storage facility.

This parcel and all adjoining land is zoned residential and much of it is heirs' property. We are grateful that this developer ultimately did the right thing. Unfortunately, there are many developers who do not.

Predatory Development of Heirs' Property

Coastal South Carolina has become a haven for predatory developers who deliberately and systematically target unwary heirs of generational family-owned property in longstanding traditional minority communities.

A common scheme is that the developer approaches an unsuspecting heir and offers to buy a small fraction of family-owned land. Once the sale goes through, the developer, as part-owner of the land, brings a legal action to force the sale of the entire parcel at auction.

The developer ultimately bids on and acquires all the land for pennies on the dollar and evicts the family members, after which the land is either developed or sold. The developer walks away with a huge profit while the heirs get next to nothing and lose their family land and cultural heritage in the process. The whole community suffers.

We see the spoils of this despicable practice throughout our community, and we understand another example is on its way to Planning Commission in the near future. As citizens of the Waccamaw Neck, we must stand together and speak with one voice against developers who engage in this reprehensible conduct at the expense of our community and its cultural heritage.

Update

Keep It Green Advocacy was privileged to represent the Governor's family and other neighboring landowners in opposition to a request by developer's attorney Dan Stacy to INCREASE DENSITY along the marsh on Pawleys Island Creek.

There were more than 220 letters of opposition and the chamber was packed with people many of whom spoke. Thankfully, the Planning Commission voted to DENY. Let's hope County Council does the same.

Thanks to all who sent letters and attended the hearing. We will keep you posted about dates for the council meetings.

We have a new and exciting opportunity for the month of May!

What Can We Do About Speeding in LCC?

Speeding remains the number one concern expressed by LCC POA members. At our recent POA annual meeting, a lieutenant from the Georgetown County Sheriff's Office (GCSO), indicated that if members observe **excessive** speeding, they can report the license number of the offending vehicle better yet, they can send a photo of the license plate to GCSO and an officer will contact the owner of that vehicle warning them about speeding in Litchfield Country Club. For commercial vehicles the same applies or we can report the company name and the time of the infraction.

Common sense should be applied so that the GCSO is not overburdened by following up on reported speeding that is estimated to be less than, say 35 mph. Please use your best judgment. The higher speed drivers pose the most danger to walkers, children and pets.

To report an excessive speeding incident contact POA Safety Director, **Ken Fetzner**, (ken@litchfieldpoa.com). GCSO would prefer that these notifications come from a single source. To ensure reporting accuracy, it would be better to email Ken rather than calling him."

Your POA will continue to hire off-duty GCSO deputies to patrol our streets and a special committee has been set up to determine additional efforts to control speeding in LCC. If you have recommendations for this committee, please contact Director **Julie Noie** (julie@litchfieldpoa.com).

WILDLIFE

Certain wildlife can become problems. Here are a few tips that may minimize visits from unwelcome animals. 🐸🐸🐶🐍🐻

- Remove any **pet food** from outside your house after the pet has been fed.
- Secure garbage containers and eliminate garbage odors.
- Clean up birdseed scattered on the ground beneath feeders.
- Securely close all entryways to access beneath trailers or houses (including garage doors).
- Do not approach or handle wildlife that appears friendly.
- Don't leave small children outside unattended.
- Don't allow pets to run free. 🐕🐕🐕

We need volunteer Neighborhood Watch drivers

Our Litchfield Country Club POA (LCC POA) operates a neighborhood watch program staffed by volunteer member drivers. Watch Drivers cruise our streets daily looking for signs of trouble, illegal activity, speeding, improper parking, and neighbors in need of assistance. Drivers then log the results of their watch.

Our drivers typically perform their one-week tours on a quarterly basis. Each tour of our Litchfield Country Club roads takes a little over an hour. It is easy and a good way to meet neighbors, support safety, and become more familiar with your neighborhood. The Georgetown County Sheriff's Department has praised our neighborhood watch program as one of the best around.

Penalties for golf cart violations in Georgetown Cty:

Penalties for violation of state laws governing the operation of low speed vehicles – including golf carts – on roadways have recently changed! Such violations are considered a misdemeanor under state law, and **conviction is punishable by a fine of up to \$100 or imprisonment for up to 30 days.**

The following requirements are included in the laws for operation of golf carts in the state and in Georgetown County.

- A person operating a permitted golf cart must be at least 16 years of age and hold a valid driver's license.
- A golf cart operating on roadways must have liability insurance.
- A golf cart has to be permitted by the State of South Carolina. An individual or business owner of a vehicle commonly known as a golf cart may obtain a permit decal and registration from the Dept. of Motor Vehicles upon presenting proof of ownership and liability insurance for the golf cart and upon payment of a \$5 fee.
- A golf cart can only be operated during day light hours, including carts with headlights and turn signals.
- The operator of a permitted golf cart being operated on a highway or street must have in their possession: 1) the registration certificate; 2) proof of liability insurance for the golf cart, and 3) their valid driver's license.
- A permitted golf cart may be operated within four miles of the address on the registration certificate and only on a secondary highway or street for which the posted speed limit is 35 miles an hour or less. Highway 17 Business in Murrells Inlet is not considered a secondary highway.
- A golf cart cannot be operated on a public bike path or public beaches in Georgetown County.

Please do not hurt me or my mom. We just temporarily moved to the neighborhood so we could be safe. If you have suddenly seen a fox in the yard near your home, there is a good reason for this. It is denning season. Between the end of March and early April, a mother fox will give birth to between 2 and 4 kits (a baby fox is called a kit). A coyote will often find a fox den, dig out the babies and kill them. A mother fox knows this and will intentionally choose a den site close to people, away from where the

coyotes generally travel. A fox will often den under a porch, shed, garage, barn or side of a hill trying to keep her little family safe. Please offer them a short-term rental as this is not a permanent situation.

If you are lucky enough to see how beautiful an adult fox is, or witness the kits playing (at a safe distance), you will be glad you did! It is not uncommon for Red Foxes to change dens several times during the season, so you may not see them for long. Kits are slow to develop and will not leave the den until they are about a month old. Foxes do not live in a den year-round, only when a mother has babies. During the summer as the kits grow older, you will see less and less of them. By September, everyone will have packed up and moved on.

Please do not call a service to “relocate them”, they will often be killed. If you see a fox during the day, it does NOT mean she is rabid. A mother fox works tirelessly to feed her kits and will often be out during daylight hours foraging for food. Foxes are omnivores, generally feeding on berries, grasses and small rodents. They are solitary and prefer to be left alone. They do not want to hunt and eat your children, mate with your dog, or kill your cat. A fox wants a place to raise her family safely, please allow her to do that.




