#### More Annual Meeting notes:

We heard continuing concern about Vehicle speeding in the LCC Neighborhood. We announced the installation of a third radar speed display unit on Country Club Drive. These displays have demonstrated they are effective in mitigating vehicle speeding.

Hiring off-duty deputies for traffic enforcement in LCC had proven to be effective, but that resource was not available during pandemic days. But, be advised that we will now begin doing that again, so WATCH YOUR SPEED.

#### What are LOST and CPST?



Five years ago, when Founders Group shut down the Litchfield Racquet Club in Litchfield Country Club, a developer wanted to buy the 8+ acres of open space and turn it into 108 apartments within a single-family neighborhood. A rezoning to allow a high-density

development, significantly increasing traffic and adversely affecting local stormwater runoff and flooding issues, spurred a group of locally concerned citizens to form Keep It Green. We successfully opposed such inappropriate development and continued on to monitor future land use policy and promote smart development on the entire Waccamaw Neck.

Many of you know who we are and have supported us by attending meetings and donating generously. For those who are not entirely familiar with Keep It Green (KIG), here's a little history:

Since our founding five years ago, KIG has formed a sister organization, Keep It Green Advocacy (KIGA), a nonprofit public interest legal organization, which represents local residents and citizens groups in holding Georgetown County accountable to follow proper law and procedure. In our first year of eligibility to participate in Palmetto Giving Day, last year, KIGA finished 11<sup>th</sup> of 83 nonprofit organizations in Georgetown County. #### Have you heard of St. Christopher's Children?

Have you heard of St. Christopher's Children? We are a nonprofit organization established in 2007, providing needed clothing and critical orthodontic care for children in Georgetown County, SC, when no one else is there to help with these services. Each year we help over 300 children with basic clothing and have a wait list for orthodontic care. The children are the HEART of our mission. We provide new clothing personally selected by one of our volunteer shoppers. Orthodontic care is prioritized based on the severity of the case. We work closely with local school nurses who see firsthand the needs of these children.

Last year, St Christophers Children provided 25 children with orthodontic care, 241 children with new clothing, and 175 new coats were distributed. 

#### November: National Adopt-a-Senior Pet Month (cont.)

CeCe is just one of the dogs we currently have in foster. As one of our younger dogs at 6 years old, Cece came to us as a rescue. A nice woman saw her posted on Facebook as a free dog and decided to take her in and save her by reaching out to us to see if we could get her a forever home through the rescue network. The woman offered to be a foster for Salty Dogs while we vetted Cece and searched for the right home. While she was in foster, it became noticeable that she was experiencing a wobbly demeanor, where her hind legs would slip and slide when she plays, sometimes causing her to fall; additionally, she was underweight. While her new family has been helping her to gain some weight and confidence, we ensured a full vet checkup to determine why her rear legs tend to wobble.

Salty Dogs had extensive vetting completed to include x-rays and blood work, as the initial thought is that she was born with a disability. If needed we were prepared to refer her to specialty care in Mt. Pleasant. However, the x-rays and bloodwork, show no indication as to why her rear legs tend to wobble. Nothing to indicate her condition. As we were focused on trying to determine the cause of this, CeCe was getting stronger and fuller of life in her foster home. She has been playing with the family dog and their son daily. By playing we mean racing, wrestling, full out dog play! We started her on CBD chews as well and guess what? CeCe doesn't wobble anymore; this has been after only a few weeks. Rather than put her through more unnecessary tests, we decided to continue with what's working. She may experience this condition again, but as the vet has said, "this dog is happy and in no pain".



She is a dog with a great, sweet personality. She does like to play with another dog, so a home with a canine companion would be a plus. Also, she enjoys kids. A fenced yard and few stairs would be a bonus. She is a lab mix and ready for a family, currently weight 49 lbs. but needs to gain about another 10 to be at a healthy weight. #### **Blossoms For Books**



"If you're a South Carolinian, when the Lowcountry calls, you have to go. It's a law of nature. And if you're lucky enough that your destination is Pawleys Island, that's all the better."

That could very well be Robert Lamb talking, but it's not. Well, it is. Sort of.


In actuality, that quote about the greatness of Pawleys Island is from Ben Blake, a character in Lamb's latest book, "The Ties That Bind (A Family Saga)," his fifth novel since his 1991 debut, "Striking Out." The new book, released in December 2023, is already a top seller on Amazon's Southern Fiction "hot new releases."

Still, the quote could have just as easily come from Lamb, himself a Pawleys Island resident and a lifelong Southerner. For the 88-year-old writer, there's no place like home.

"A character in my book," Lamb mused recently from his Pawleys Island home on Crooked Oak Drive, "says it best: 'If you can't get your mind right in the Carolina Lowcountry, there's no hope for you.'"

"The Ties That Bind (A Family Saga)" revives Ben Blake, a character used in two of Lamb's other novels, "Atlanta Blues" and "A Majority of One." In the latest, Blake, a writer-in-residence at a Southern university, is summoned to Atlanta by the emotional breakdown of his son Charles, an architect with no history of mental illness, but whose mother killed herself when he was 15. Ben agrees to help Charles' psychiatrist reconstruct her new patient's history; Charles has remained silent. But when it is revealed that Charles has furtively planned to enter the Catholic priesthood, Ben, who is not religious, feels bereft: He has not only lost his wife, but will he now lose his son, an only child, and the prospect of grandchildren, too? In other words, Ben will be working against his own self-interests.

#### What Can We Do About Speeding in LCC?

Speeding remains the number one concern expressed by LCC POA members. At our recent POA annual meeting, a lieutenant from the Georgetown County Sheriff's Office (GCSO), indicated that if members observe excessive speeding, they can report the license number of the offending vehicle better yet, they can send a photo of the license plate to GCSO and an officer will contact the owner of that vehicle warning them about spending in Litchfield Country Club. For commercial vehicles the same applies or we can report the company name and the time of the infraction.

Common sense should be applied so that the GGSO is not overburdened by following up on reported speeding that is estimated to be less than, say 35 mph. Please use your best judgment. The higher speed drivers pose the most danger to walkers, children and pets.

GCSO would prefer that these notifications come from a single source. To ensure reporting accuracy, it would be better to email Ken rather than calling him."





#### WILDLIFE

Certain wildlife can become problems. Here are a few tips that may minimize visits from unwelcome animals. **3.2** 

- Remove any pet food from outside your house after the pet has been fed.
- Secure garbage containers and eliminate garbage odors.
- Clean up birdseed scattered on the ground beneath feeders.
- Securely close all entryways to access beneath trailers or houses (including garage doors).
- Do not approach or handle wildlife that appears friendly.
- Don't leave small children outside unattended.
- Don't allow pets to run free. 🦮 🦮 🖔

Golf Cart Rules 32

#### Penalties for golf cart violations in Georgetown Cty:

Penalties for violation of state laws governing the operation of low speed vehicles – including golf carts – on roadways have recently changed! Such violations are considered a misdemeanor under state law, and conviction is punishable by a fine of up to \$100 or imprisonment for up to 30 days.

# The following requirements are included in the laws for operation of golf carts in the state and in Georgetown County.

- A person operating a permitted golf cart must be at least 16 years of age and hold a valid driver's license.
- A golf cart operating on roadways must have liability insurance.
- A golf cart has to be permitted by the State of South Carolina. An individual or business owner
  of a vehicle commonly known as a golf cart may obtain a permit decal and registration from
  the Dept. of Motor Vehicles upon presenting proof of ownership and liability insurance for
  the golf cart and upon payment of a \$5 fee.
- A golf cart can only be operated during day light hours, including carts with headlights and turn signals.
- The operator of a permitted golf cart being operated on a highway or street must have in their possession: 1) the registration certificate; 2) proof of liability insurance for the golf cart, and 3) their valid driver's license.
- A permitted golf cart may be operated within four miles of the address on the registration certificate and only on a secondary highway or street for which the posted speed limit is 35 miles an hour or less. Highway 17 Business in Murrells Inlet is not considered a secondary highway.
- A golf cart cannot be operated on a public bike path or public beaches in Georgetown County.
