We hope Y'All have noticed that the LIGHTS ARE BACK ON at the Country Club Drive entryway and our US flag is flying again. The entryway is so much more attractive and impressive with those improvements. Kudos and thanks go out to Andrea Berkeley, Elinor Harrington and the others who "made it happen". Your LCC POA provided funding for the electrical work, about \$5,000.00, and for the irrigation repair and new plantings. Watch for more front end enhancements. We are still very much at work trying to develop a "permanent" maintenance plan for that entryway.

At the recent annual meeting, the issue of vehicle speeding in our LCC neighborhood was discussed. Vehicle speeding is, of course, a long-running and ongoing issue. It is a ubiquitous issue, present in almost every similar neighborhood. The radar speed display signs which your LCC POA, with help from Georgetown County, has installed doubtless help mitigate the problem. In years past, your LCC POA has hired "off duty" Georgetown County Sheriff Deputies to do vehicle speed patrols in the LCC neighborhood. If we see the problem worsening, we may again consider hiring "off duty" deputies again to do vehicle speed monitoring.

What can we do about speeding in LCC?

Speeding remains the number one concern expressed by LCC POA members. At our recent POA annual meeting, a lieutenant from the Georgetown County Sheriff's Office (GCSO), indicated that if members observe **excessive** speeding, they can report the license number of the offending vehicle better yet, they can send a photo of the license plate to GCSO and an officer will contact the owner of that vehicle warning them about speeding in Litchfield Country Club. For commercial vehicles the same applies or we can report the company name and the time of the infraction.

Common sense should be applied so that the GCSO is not overburdened by following up on reported speeding that is estimated to be less than, say 35 mph. Please use your best judgment. The higher speed drivers pose the most danger to walkers, children and pets.

To report an excessive speeding incident contact POA Safety Director, **Ken Fetzner**, (ken@litchfieldpoa.com). GCSO would prefer that these notifications come from a single source. To ensure reporting accuracy, it would be better to email Ken rather than calling him."

Thanks for your efforts to make LCC a safer neighborhood.

We are a nonprofit organization established in 2007, providing needed clothing and critical orthodontic care for children in Georgetown County, SC, when no one else is there to help with these services. Each year we help over 300 children with basic clothing and have a wait list for orthodontic care. The children are the HEART of our mission. We provide new clothing personally selected by one of our volunteer shoppers. Orthodontic care is prioritized based on the severity of the case. We work closely with local school nurses who see firsthand the needs of these children.

Last year, St Christopher's Children provided 21 children with orthodontic care, 143 children with new clothing, and 154 new coats were distributed. A Special Thank You From The Litchfield Beautification Foundation

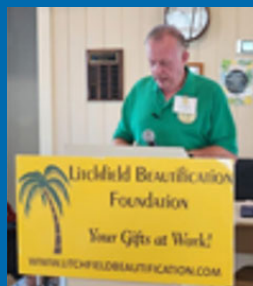

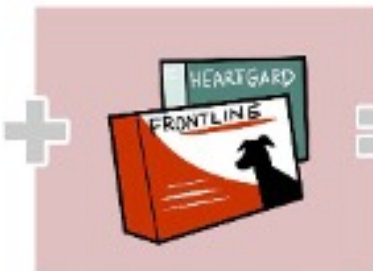

Keep It Green (KIP)



Well, we survived the snow and cold weather, got by Groundhog Day and now we're looking forward to Daylight Savings Time starting in about 4 weeks (March 8th, if you want to mark your calendar). Keep It Green (KIG) continues to monitor activity related to land use and development on the Waccamaw Neck, particularly when it comes to rezoning.

Here are some updates on local happenings to keep you informed about current events:

- You may be wondering about all the black silt fencing at the Route 17 entrance to LCC. It is part of a larger drainage project to improve flooding along Route 17. It involves installing larger piping under the highway and tying into the two ponds at the LCC entrance, redirecting stormwater runoff down Channel Bluff Avenue and into the salt marsh. It also includes an area at the end of Crooked Oak Drive.
- Magic Oaks Estates, a 27-unit single family development south of the Hammock Shops, received final 3rd Reading approval from County Council at their last meeting in January. District 2 Councilman Bob Anderson was the only vote opposed. SCDES still has not approved a controversial stormwater management system for the property, which would handle runoff not by ponds but through an infiltration system in the ground where the water table is already very high. KIG and abutting property owners, including the owner of the Village Shops, have expressed serious concerns about flooding and stormwater on this property at a public hearing with SCDES last year.
- An item on last month's Planning Commission agenda included an application for rezoning 6.7 acres at the corner of Route 17 and Boyle Drive in North Litchfield, from Neighborhood Commercial (NC) to General Commercial (GC). Discussions between the property Agent and the Litchfield Beaches POA (LBPOA) board indicated an interest in putting in an "upscale" gas station/convenience store, like a Parker's Kitchen. KIG met with LBPOA board members to discuss options to oppose the rezoning, and many residents expressed concerns as well. Ultimately, the property owner withdrew the application from the meeting agenda, knowing that it would be a tough sell in the current environment.
- For years, residents of the Waccamaw Neck have opposed higher density development in our neighborhoods, arguing that there is a lot of land in the western part of the County that can better handle the growth. Now, there are numerous proposals and applications popping up in those areas, and many residents don't like what they're seeing, stating that it would ruin the rural lifestyle they are accustomed to. One residential development was approved by Planning Commission because it was in compliance with the current zoning and land use maps. Another, which would have required rezoning for high density, was recently withdrawn by the owner after much opposition from local residents.

Keep It Green (KIP) (cont.)

- **Another large scale residential/commercial development has been in the works for the western part of the County for some time, and you may start to hear more about Crown Pointe. Over 3,000 housing units, single family and multi-family, are planned for an area between Brown's Ferry Road (Rt. 51) and Route 701 going to Plantersville. There will also be land allocated for commercial businesses to support those residences. There are multiple phases that will take place over the next 10-15 years.**

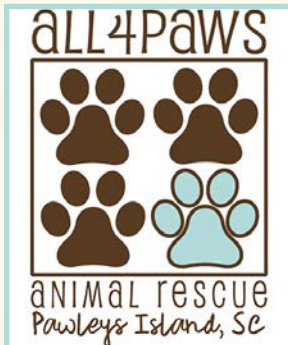
KIG has led the way in citizen advocacy over the last 7 years right here on the Waccamaw Neck, and we may see similar efforts organized in other parts of the County. Growth is inevitable, but it must be managed in a responsible way that reflects current infrastructure. We couldn't do what we do without all your support, and we are so grateful.

WILDLIFE

Certain wildlife can become problems. Here are a few tips that may minimize visits from unwelcome animals. 🐸🐸🐶🐍🐻

- Remove any **pet food** from outside your house after the pet has been fed.
- Secure garbage containers and eliminate garbage odors.
- Clean up birdseed scattered on the ground beneath feeders.
- Securely close all entryways to access beneath trailers or houses (including garage doors).
- Do not approach or handle wildlife that appears friendly.
- Don't leave small children outside unattended.
- Don't allow pets to run free. 🐕🐕🐕

Penalties for golf cart violations in Georgetown Cty:

Penalties for violation of state laws governing the operation of low speed vehicles – including golf carts – on roadways have recently changed! Such violations are considered a misdemeanor under state law, and **conviction is punishable by a fine of up to \$100 or imprisonment for up to 30 days.**

The following requirements are included in the laws for operation of golf carts in the state and in Georgetown County.

- A person operating a permitted golf cart must be at least 16 years of age and hold a valid driver's license.
- A golf cart operating on roadways must have liability insurance.
- A golf cart has to be permitted by the State of South Carolina. An individual or business owner of a vehicle commonly known as a golf cart may obtain a permit decal and registration from the Dept. of Motor Vehicles upon presenting proof of ownership and liability insurance for the golf cart and upon payment of a \$5 fee.
- A golf cart can only be operated during day light hours, including carts with headlights and turn signals.
- The operator of a permitted golf cart being operated on a highway or street must have in their possession: 1) the registration certificate; 2) proof of liability insurance for the golf cart, and 3) their valid driver's license.
- A permitted golf cart may be operated within four miles of the address on the registration certificate and only on a secondary highway or street for which the posted speed limit is 35 miles an hour or less. Highway 17 Business in Murrells Inlet is not considered a secondary highway.
- A golf cart cannot be operated on a public bike path or public beaches in Georgetown County.
